Analogue flanger pedals first appeared in the late 1970s and fall into the category of modulation effects. They work by combining the original input signal with an electronically delayed signal. To the best of our knowledge, most, but not all opamps have negative on pins 2 and 6, and positive on 3, and 5, but not always. As with other pedals, we'll have to put this on an oscilloscope to make sure whether it inverts phase or not. Those remaining transistors and opamps aren't touching the sound signal directly, and so do not affect the signal phase in the pedal. Flangers belong to the same family of modulation effects as chorus and phaser. The Boss BF2 was produced by the company between 1981 and 2002, after which it was replaced by the BF3 pedal which is still in production today. If that's too technical, then the BF2 is your ticket to a wonderful world of swirling, aeroplane-like sounds. Seriously, though, a flanger is a useful sonic colour to have at your disposal for those times when chorus is too tame and a phaser is too funky. As with other Boss pedals, there's a 9V battery compartment accessible underneath the footswitch. MANUAL also acts as a finetuning knob, as some of the overtones produced by the pedal might not always sit nicely with the key of whatever you happen to be playing. It is a very sturdy pedal on top of that. I have had no problems with it and I have had it with well over a year now. This boss pedal is to a high standard and creates no hiss. The Ultra flange option gives you a more intense flange sound which I found very useful. For a more subtle sound the standard one fitted my requirements perfectly. The only disadvantage with the pedal is that it can take a long time to find the right flange sound you want as you have to create it yourself. I probably wouldn't recommend running it over with your car, but I also wouldn't bet against it functioning if you'd unfortunately done so. One of the most attractive features that always draws me back to Boss is their size. Being a sound junkie I am always experimenting with various arrangements of pedals on my board, and by using Boss pedals that are built extremely concise they permit musicians such as myself the ability to fit far more pedals on one board than if I were to use pedals of different makes. In closing Boss Pedals are great sounding, easy to use, superior construction, easy to modify and relatively inexpensive. I do own many other brands of pedals but when I am in the market for something new to produce some new desired tone required by a particular song or arrangement I always check Boss's lineup first for all the reasons listed previously to see if they have something to accommodate. I'm sure the newer version is no different outside of separate guitar and bass inputs. Maybe 1 and 11 respectively or right in between. That will get you close enough to tweak from there. Once you shut it off it still adds some high frequencies on your signal path. The best use for me would be with a looper true bypass where I can choose how I want my signal at the time. Straight clean, distorted, wah, or flanger. 4 stars only for not being true bypass. But it's got all the tone adjustments you need while making it easy to use. And as always, all of Boss's pedals are built like tanks. Mine has taken quite a beating yet still works and sounds like new. Then, with manual fully counterclockwise, pick a note and pluck it over and over again, slowly. Listen to the sweep all the way up, all the way down, and all the way up again. Now, put the manual control fully clockwise and repeat the listening test. Its subtle, but its definitely there. I can even hear it just from the self generated noise the thing makes with no input signal. Oh yeah, and to REALLY prove it, pop open the thing and tweak the internal RES pot up a bit, with the right twiddling you should be able to get it to self oscillate, and youll find the manual control has a significant effect on the tone it produces. When Depth is at minimum the delay time is controlled entirely by Manual. When Depth is at maximum the delay time is controlled solely by the LFO. Obviously things are too confusing for some people and I will have to give some thought on how to make the effect easier to adjust or clarify the controls. If anything, the flanger block is superior to the delay block for flanging because you have more precise control over the time. The new algorithms now model the behavior of classic bucketbrigade device BBD units except they are true stereo. The Depth parameter works somewhat differently now and sets the maximum delay time up to 20 ms. When Auto Depth is not off the maximum delay is reduced as the rate is increased. There are now three Auto Depth values Low, Medium and High. Turning Auto Depth to Off allows complete control over the delay time. Unfortunately, you cant get the full range of the knobs at once, so you have to set the range you find most useful. I didn't realize there were trim pots, so you've got me wanting to tinker. If you have a looper, a good way to set the trims is to tweak while the pedal is in use. Set the face dial of the trim you want to adjust to min or max before twisting in the backdoor.
